# DUAL OBLIGATIONS FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS

Christmas falls on a Monday this year and remains a holy day of obligation. The previous day, Sunday, December 24, the Fourth Sunday of Advent, has its own distinct obligation. As a result, there are two separate obligations to fulfill. On the evening of Sunday, December 24, the prayers and readings of the appropriate Christmas Mass would be used, and Evening Prayer I of the Nativity is prayed. Nonetheless, attending Mass on Sunday evening any time after 4 p.m. can count toward either the Fourth Sunday of Advent obligation or the Christmas obligation, but not both.

FROM THE CATECHISM:

PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH SECTION TWO I. THE CREEDS CHAPTER TWO I BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY SON OF GOD.

Article 4

"JESUS CHRIST SUFFERED UNDER PONTIUS PILATE, WAS CRUCIFIED, DIED AND WAS BURIED"

Paragraph 2. JESUS DIED CRUCIFIED II. CHRIST'S REDEMPTIVE DEATH IN GOD'S PLAN OF SALVATION

601 The Scriptures had foretold this divine plan of salvation through the putting to death of "the righteous one, my Servant" as a mystery of universal redemption, that is, as the ransom that would free men from the slavery of sin. Citing a confession of faith that he himself had "received", St. Paul professes that "Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures." In particular Jesus' redemptive death fulfils Isaiah's prophecy of the suffering

Servant. Indeed Jesus himself explained the meaning of his life and death in the light of God's suffering Servant. After his Resurrection he gave this interpretation of the

Scriptures to the disciples at Emmaus, and then to the apostles.

"For our sake God made him to be sin" 602 Consequently, St. Peter can formulate the apostolic faith in the divine plan of salvation in this way: "You were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your fathers... with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. He was destined before the foundation of the world but was made manifest at the end of the times for your sake." Man's sins, following on original sin, are punishable by death. By sending his own Son in the form of a slave, in the form of a fallen humanity, on account of sin, God "made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."
