



## What is the Fancy Fair?

This event is a major annual fund raiser for Altar & Rosary Sodality to support charities. Tables are set up and rented to "crafters" who sell their quality homemade fare such as jewelry, fall and Christmas decorations, clothing, religious items, kitchen and bath items, etc. Patrons purchase these items directly from the vendors. The Rosary Sodality will also have soup available for purchase.

## What is the Cookie Bar?

St. Gaspar's is famous for their homemade cookies donated by parishioners (12 dozen each). Several parishioners donate their time to arrange hundreds of cookies and to set up and clean up the Cookie Bar and preparation room. Long tables are lined up to place trays of an assortment of cookies. Patrons will pay for one size box this year. The cookies will be \$10.00 a dozen. This year we will be selling soup by the quart to go for \$8.00. Pies will be available for purchase as well. They will range in price from \$15.00 - \$25.00. New plastic bags are given as well to put the boxes in for transportation.

## What are the Charities?

Charities annually funded by the Rosary Sodality are: Helping Hands, Noble House, Sisters of St. Joseph, Franciscans of Mary, Life & Family Services, St. Martin Health Care in Garrett, Sacred Heart Home in Avilla, school supplies and warm clothing for local school children in need as well as helping to fund St. Gaspar Church projects and parishioners in need.



FROM THE CATECHISM:

PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH SECTION TWO I. THE CREEDS CHAPTER THREE ARTICLE 9
"I BELIEVE IN THE HOLY CATHOLIC CHURCH"

Paragraph 3. THE CHURCH IS ONE, HOLY, CATHOLIC, AND APOSTOLIC

Toward unity

Who belongs to the Catholic Church? 836 "All men are called to this catholic unity of the People of God.... and to it, in different ways, belong or are ordered: the Catholic faithful, others who believe in Christ, and finally all mankind, called by God's grace to salvation."

837 "Fully incorporated into the society of the Church are those who, possessing the Spirit of Christ, accept all the means of salvation given to the Church together with her entire organization, and who - by the bonds constituted by the

profession of faith, the sacraments, ecclesiastical government, and communion - are joined in the visible structure of the Church of Christ, who rules her through the Supreme Pontiff and the bishops. Even though incorporated into the Church, one who does not however persevere in charity is not saved. He remains indeed in the bosom of the Church, but 'in body' not 'in heart."

838 "The Church knows that she is joined in many ways to the baptized who are honored by the name of Christian, but do not profess the Catholic faith in its entirety or have not preserved unity or communion under the successor of Peter." Those "who believe in Christ and have been properly baptized are put in a certain, although imperfect, communion with the Catholic Church." With the Orthodox Churches, this communion is so profound "that it lacks little to attain the fullness that would permit a common celebration of the Lord's Eucharist."
